Second Sunday of Lent

Brothers and Sisters,

One of the powerful images during Lent is the Lord's temptation in the wilderness. There He confronts the deceiver, the Devil, Satan, the Father of Lies.

One of the devil's favorite lies is to make people believe he doesn't exist. Furthermore, he wants us to believe that the whole supernatural realm does not exist. One of the ways he does this is to get Catholics to downplay or even deny the reality of the supernatural realm.

They usually do not do this explicitly, instead they deny the supernatural by shifting their emphasis away from the spiritual battle toward the struggles in the ordinary world. They yield to the temptation to turn their religion into a sensible method of doing good works in the world. Thus, their Catholic faith becomes a fellowship time, a time for education, or an action group to change the world.

This is not the main purpose of religion. You can be involved in good works, help the poor, campaign for justice, educate children, and work for a good cause without being religious.

One of the fundamentals of our faith is that through our religion we are involved in a supernatural transaction. We're dealing with the devil. We're dealing with the divine. We're engaged in a cosmic battle with heaven and hell, and salvation at stake. If we forget this or deny the reality of the supernatural, we have fallen prey to the devil's lies.

We sometimes think that the supernatural is only evidenced in the stupendous things like visions of Mary, exorcisms, miracles, and paranormal phenomena. However, the supernatural realm is not separate from our everyday world. It is woven in and through all that we do. There is a supernatural dimension to our ordinary conversations, decisions, and actions in life.

On the dark side, the devil is constantly tempting us to yield to greed, lust, insecurity, worry, fear, and his whole worldly agenda. On the light side, every time we say 'yes' to God, every time we pray, worship, stop to be kind to another person, and spread God's love, we are engaged in the battle and are accomplishing something good not only in the natural world, but in the supernatural realm as well.

One of the foundations of the Catholic faith is to see life as shot through with supernatural graces and supernatural temptations.

Lent is a time when we sharpen our awareness of these truths. Through prayer and fasting and almsgiving we make new connections with the supernatural reality of our faith. We remind ourselves that "we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against the spiritual forces of wickedness in high places."

Keep a good Lent, and fight the good fight!

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat
