Second Sunday of Lent

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Catholic Church teaches us that, as Catholics we have both privileges and responsibilities. The privileges and responsibilities go hand in hand. You can't have one without the other. The basic responsibilities of Catholics are laid down in the seven precepts of the Church. My letter in the parish bulletin during these weeks of Lent will remind you.

The first precept is to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, and resting from servile works. Notice that the obligation is to attend Mass, not necessarily to receive Holy Communion. If a Catholic is in an irregular marriage, or is in a state of mortal sin or believes he might be, then he or she should not receive communion. However, he or she is still obliged to attend Mass.

The obligation to attend Mass is a serious obligation. Remember the saying, "You can miss Mass, but you can't skip Mass." In other words, if there is a serious reason for not attending Mass--like looking after a sick relative or young child, then it is not a serious sin, but to skip Mass for any other reason is a serious sin because you are putting something else before God. If parents do not take their children to Mass, they compound their sin by causing scandal to the young and setting a bad example. Put simply, you are saying to your children, "Mass doesn't really matter. We can let it slide sometimes."

This first precept of the church is linked with the first three of the ten commandments to 1) Have only one God 2) To honor and reverence the Lord's name and 3) To keep holy the "Sabbath Day" for the Jews of the Old Covenant the Sabbath was Saturday. We honor the first day of the week as a celebration of the Lord's resurrection.

The second aspect of keeping the Lord's Day holy is to rest from servile work. This means you should not do hard labor or work on a Sunday. These days when so many businesses are open it is hard for some people to avoid work on Sundays. Try to keep the principle of the Sabbath and at least get some extra rest and relaxation and time with friends and family on Sundays.

When you put God first by making Mass attendance a priority, and making a special day for rest and recreation you immediately establish the right priorities in every aspect of your life.
