RESPECT LIFE LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

• Support the Age Verification Act (H3424) This bill would protect minors from the harms of pornographic content by requiring porn sites to prove that those viewing their content are not minors.

• Support the Help, Not Harm Bill (H4624). This bill would protect children from harmful gender reassignment surgeries, hormonal treatments and other experimental treatments that can leave them permanently scarred for life. Contact your SC Senator (the bill has passed the SC House).
