Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Friday we remembered St. Francis of Assisi. So how do you find Francis? The temptation is always to sentimentalize him. He was more than the little poor brother, the preacher to birds and the singer of songs to Brother Sun and Sister Moon.

Furthermore, in today's sentimentalized age it is all too easy to turn St. Francis into the poster boy for fashionable causes. Yes, he loved nature and stands for our proper stewardship of the world's resources, but he is not just a proto-environmentalist. Yes, he was for poverty, but he really lived it. He didn't just show off and pretend he was poor. The question of poverty and riches is as potent and controversial in our age as it has ever been.

While we admire St. Francis and the Franciscans for their love of poverty, we also realize that many who seem rich are in fact very poor, while many who seem poor are rich. We can never judge by outward appearances. Material wealth is not bad in itself, just as poverty is not good in and of itself. The question is not how much money we have, but what we do with it. The question is not how wealthy we are, but whether we are prepared to leave it all behind, because one day we will indeed leave it all behind.

The example of St. Francis challenges our attitude to our wealth. Can we live generously and give generously? If so, we will have joy and freedom. If not, we will lapse into greed, mean heartedness, and lack of compassion.



Sep. 25 - Nov. 3. The overturn of Roe and the S.C. Supreme Court's decision to uphold the Fetal Heartbeat Bill are signs of great hope for the end of abortion. However, abortions are still performed before a heartbeat is detected, for rape and incest, and fetal anomalies. We must continue to pray and draw attention to this human tragedy until life is protected from conception to natural death.

40 Days for Life is a prayer campaign to end abortion. This prayer campaign is initiated and organized at the grassroots level in communities throughout the nation and abroad. The National Organization requires that those participating in a campaign sign a promise to conduct themselves in a peaceful, respectful manner.

The backbone of the whole pro-life ministry is prayer. No Crisis Pregnancy Center, Sidewalk Ministry, Post Abortion Ministry, or Maternity Home can exist without our prayers. Many believe the Holy Spirit is using this movement to end abortion and at the same time bring people of many faiths together.
