Our Lord’s Promise of Exceptional Grace on Divine Mercy Sunday

In 1936 Jesus revealed to St. Faustina Kowalska:

“I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain **complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.**”
